On September 23 - 26, a select group of speakers integral to the adoption, ratification, and adherence of the Montreal Protocol will gather in Athens Greece to discuss the success the Montreal protocol has seen since is adoption in 1987. This symposium is called, "Ozone Depletion: from its discovery to Envisat and Aura."

Per the Montreal Protocol 20th Anniversary website, "The Symposium will take place in the Athens Concert Hall, Greece, close to the dates of the 19th Meeting of Contracting Parties to the Montreal Protocol and it will bring together distinguished scientists, policy makers, industry people and NGOs who have contributed to the protection of the ozone layer. Symposium participants will review scientific progress made since the signing of the Protocol in 1987 and will highlight the lessons this process holds for the continued implementation of the Protocol and for addressing other global environmental issues."

In addition to the symposium, this very exciting meeting of influential members responsible for the Protocol will feature several educational sessions that will take a look at the past, present, and future of the Protocol. Recent scientific findings relevant to the Protocol will be unveiled and discussed for the first time.

On September 16, 1987, the Montreal Protocol was introduced with the intent to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and begin the recovery of our ozone layer. Twenty years later, its significance and impact on the world and the ozone layer can be seen throughout the achievements reported by the United National Environment Programme. In addition, the Protocol is still going strong and many countries have changed their greenhouse gas usage to reflect its strong suggestions. I made this dessert for Christmas Eve and it was a hit! I have since been asked to make this for family events over and over again! This is super easy and you can make several variations on it. I like to use little Ramekins (think <u>3.5" or 4.25"</u>) to make individual cobblers for everyone. Just remember, when baking in the oven put the ramekins on a cookie sheet so the filling doesn't spill over onto your oven!

Berry Cookie Cobbler

2 bags (12 ounces each) frozen mixed berries, thawed
1 container (21-ounce) apple pie filling
1/3 cup granulated sugar
1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
1 roll (18-ounce) prepared sugar cookie dough
Vanilla ice cream

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

In a large bowl, mix berries, apple filling, sugar, and cinnamon. Transfer fruit mixture to an 8 by 8 by 2-inch baking dish. Crumble cookie dough over fruit, covering thickly and completely. Bake uncovered until cookie crust is golden and crisp, and juices bubble thickly, about 45 minutes. Serve warm with ice cream.
